- Top off salads with apples and pear slices, cranberries, and pomegranate seeds.
- Spoon salsa onto a baked potato.

The food was fantastic. The setting was gorgeous. The service was quick and attentive. Of course, the people from the other senior centers were friendly.

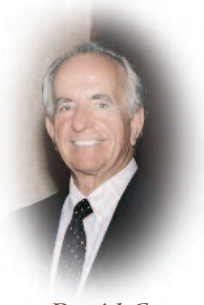

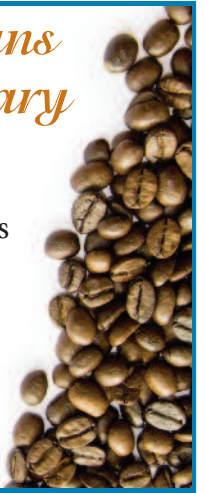

Like so many high school students and their families, Anthony (TJ) Davenport, Jr., a 2010 graduate of Brookfield East High School, applied for many scholarships to help with his college expenses. One of the scholarships he applied for was a full, four-year scholarship, to a school of his choice.



Applicants had to write an essay based on something that had changed their life. TJ wrote about when doctors found a massive tumor in his maternal grandmother's stomach, and the devastated feeling he had. Thankfully, her surgery went well, and all is good, but the feelings he felt during that time left an indelible mark on him.

Mom (*Tami Davenport, Manager of Davians Banquet & Conference Center*) explained how TJ's essay was chosen as one of three from his school for final consideration. ## D&S/DAVÍANS — DID YOU KNOW ABOUT CORN?

Corn, also called maize, is a type of grass that grows in warm soil and has shallow roots. It is grown in many countries throughout the world and is the most planted crop in the United States. Several different kinds of corn are eaten for food. These include popcorn, flour corn, flint corn, dent corn, sweet corn, waxy corn, striped maize and pod corn.

Each ear of corn contains between 200 and 400 kernels and colors of corn can range from white and yellow to red, green, purple, blue-gray and black.

Most kinds of corn grown in the United States are hybrids, or a blend of two different kinds of corn. Hybrids were created to keep pests away from crops of corn and to resist drought and disease. Other hybrids are grown for specific qualities, such as tenderness, sweetness and color. Sweet corn is the most popular type of corn for eating, and it is divided into three types by genetic makeup: normal sugary (SU), sugary enhancer (SE) and supersweet (Sh2). Normal sugary corn has a sweet and creamy kernel texture. In the SE type, the sugar content is higher, yet the tenderness and texture

of the kernels is maintained. This is considered the superior type of corn and is better for eating. With the supersweet varieties of corn, there is a higher sugar content than the other two types, but the texture is tough and are not as creamy as the other two varieties.

Corn is a versatile product. It is used in industries other than agriculture. It can be made into adhesives, plastics and fabrics, and the silks of the plant are used for herbal supplements. Feed maize is used for bio-fuel as it is cheap and can be replenished. Cornstarch is used in corn syrup to enhance flavor and volume of another product. High-fructose corn syrup is used as a preservative, thickener and sweetener.

When you go to a farmer's market or stand for corn on the cob, ask what kinds of corn they have and try different ones for a change!
